GREEK MOSAIC INSCRIPTION FROM MOUNT OF OLIVES.

With translation by A. S. MURRAY, Esq., LL.D.



The Greek inscription on the more recently found mosaic reads:—

**ΥΠΕΡ ΑΝΑΠΑΥΣΕ.ΛΣ ΕΥΣΕΒΙΟΥ ΠΡΕΣΒΥΤΟΥ  
ΘΕΟΔΟΣΙΟΥ ΔΙΑΚΓ: ΕΥΓΕΝΙΟΥ ΕΛΠΙΔΙΟΥ  
ΕΥΦΡΑΤΑ ΑΓΑΒΩΝΙΚΟΥ ΤΩΝ  
ΜΟΝΑΖΟΝΤΩΝ.**

‘Υπέρ ἀναπαύσεως Εὐσεβίου πρεσβυτ(έρου)  
Θεοδοσίου διακ(όνου) Εὐγενίου, Ἐλπιδίου,  
Εὐφράτα, Ἀγαθωνίκου τῶν  
Μοναζόντων.

“For the repose of the Presbyter Eusebius, the Deacon Theodosius, and the Anchorites Eugenius, Elpidius, Euphratas, Agathonicus.”

The Anchorites, or Monazontes, are mentioned in an inscription, C. I. Gr., 8,607.
